This is the 56th Parish Council sponsored Newsletter giving details of forthcoming events and other items we think will be of interest.

# 1. Parish Council Notes:

- a. Residents and businesses in Gloucestershire and Herefordshire are being invited to contribute to a major survey of broadband availability across the two counties. The survey is being undertaken by researchers at the Royal Agricultural University (RAU) as part of the 'Evaluation of the impact of superfast broadband in Herefordshire and Gloucestershire' due to be published in 2017. The online survey will be live until the end of November and responses will feed directly into the Fastershire project. The results will also help demonstrate the level of demand in communities that are yet to benefit from the Fastershire rollout and help to raise their profile for better broadband with potential suppliers. To take part in the survey, which should only take about 5 minutes to complete, please visit www.broadband-feedback.com.
- b. The installation of the **defibrillator in** the (former) telephone box will be completed during the week of 14-18 November and arrangements have been made for a training session to be held in the Village Hall at 11:45 a.m. on Saturday 3rd December (immediately after the monthly Fayre). So, anyone who wishes to know more about how to operate the defibrillator, just come along to the Village Hall or even come to the fayre and stay for a few minutes afterwards.
- c. Following the concerns raised over **dog fouling**, particularly in and around the churchyard the Parish Council have now purchased and installed 2 dog bins to enable dog owners to dispose of materials hygienically. One is located near the junction of Bishops Walk and Church Lane (opposite the club); the other is located further up Bishops Walk towards the road to Corse Lawn (B4211). Notices have also been erected to encourage dog owners to clean up and use the bins. These bins will be emptied on a regular basis by Tewkesbury Borough Council Refuse Department.
- d. The **Christmas lights in Tewkesbury** will be turned on by Santa Claus on Sunday 20 November. There will also be a Christmas Market in the High Street.
- e. Young Gloucestershire is an organisation that runs a **mentoring programme for 16-25 year olds** specifically to support them with their next steps in to Education, Employment or Training. Volunteers from various industries are matched with young people who want to go into that industry in order to support them and also help them grow their self-confidence and self-esteem. - f. On the subject of the **Joint Core Strategy** the Parish Council have been notified that the Ministry of Defence have now decided that a significant portion of the MoD site in Ashchurch will **not** be released for housing. The three Borough Councils will now, therefore, meet to consider the implications of this latest news and expect to make an announcement early next year.
- g. At the beginning of November, **new waste and recycling collection calendars** will be issued to all properties outlining their collection days as well as the bank holiday collection changes which will take place over the Christmas and New Year period. In addition, from April 2017, the collection days for approximately 50% of properties in
