## 1. Parish Council Notes:

- a. Further to previous announcements regarding a proposal for an improved Broadband service for Forthampton via "line-of-sight", the team offering the service have still to identify a source for the signal to be beamed into the village (they continue to search). Meanwhile investigation continues into alternative options, including a company called "Wurzel", as well as maintaining contact with Gigaclear in case their roll-out plans finally involve Forthampton.
- b. At the December Parish Council meeting the Councillors were able to agree to maintain the **annual Precept** at the current rate of £3,000. With good housekeeping it should be possible to continue to cover all costs from within this amount.
- c. The Parish Council has been advised by Gloucestershire County Council that the contract for maintaining the roads and ditches is currently out for tender and that the existing company Amey, will no longer be responsible for road maintenance.
