## 1. **Parish Council Notes:**

- b. Our next Litter Picking event has been booked for Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> April. We will meet at the bus shelter at 10 a.m. and, with enough volunteers, it should not take much longer than an hour. ## 4. Forthampton Club Notices:

- a. The Forthampton Club is a social meeting place offering reasonably priced drinks and snacks in a friendly atmosphere. It is run by volunteers and welcomes members and non-members. Winter opening times are Thursdays and Saturdays from 8pm.
- 5. At their February meeting the Forthampton and District WI were given a fascinating insight into the life of an eel, from its inception in the Sargasso Sea, where billions of eggs are laid, to its journey on the Gulf Stream to Europe and Africa in leaf-shaped form, and its return as an adult eel to the place of its birth, for breeding purposes. These incredible creatures face numerous obstacles during their voyage of survival; dams, flood defences and hydropower stations block their migration route and a large number do not survive. In addition to manmade obstacles, eel trafficking is rife. The conservation group has now begun to work with Customs officials and has already successfully brought about the successful prosecution of at least one gang, involved in smuggling eels to China where prices are high. It is also working towards increasing the eel population by building 'fish passes' to enable the eels to navigate the blocked rivers. One project is being undertaken by the Severn & Wye Smokery where eels are grown and released into a safe environment, e.g. Highnam Lake. As the speaker, Andrew Kerr, said, 'All the world's problems can be encapsulated in one fish. We all need to work together to right the situation and to help increase the population of this endangered species (as well as sorting out the problems in the world). At their next meeting, to be held in Forthampton Village Hall at 2:15pm on Tuesday, 12th March, the speaker will be the Rev'd Dr Nicholas Henderson who will 'Explain the Inexplicable - from Ghosts to Visiting Aliens'.
