

This is the Parish Council sponsored Newsletter for June 2017, giving details of past and forthcoming events and other items we think will be of interest.

### Parish Council Notes:

- a. There will be no **Parish Council Meeting** this month; the next meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> July starting at 7:45 p.m.
- b. From 19 to 23 June, **Hempsted Household Recycling Centre (HRC)** in Gloucester will be closed to finish the work already underway to accommodate more traffic and reduce queues. The changes are being made in response to customer feedback and increased use. Work includes extending the upper road area and creating a multiple lane system, as well as increasing the boundary size to accommodate heavy vehicles. The plans will also make it possible for a reuse shop to be added in the future. Alternative recycling facilities are available at the HRCs at Stoke Orchard, Fosse Cross, Wingmoor Farm, Oak Quarry and Pyke Quarry.
- c. Gloucestershire Constabulary have informed the Parish Council that, at this time of year, there is always an increase in traders in the Tewkesbury area offering services such as work on driveways, garden services and general other maintenance services, and have requested that we advise people who are considering using these services to ensure they research the company/people they are using. If you are not happy about the work do not pay and seek advice from the Citizens Advice Bureau
- d. For those who use (or are considering using) the **Staunton and Corse GP Surgery**, their Summer newsletter is attached.
- e. **Recent changes have been made to the Joint Core Strategy (JCS)**. The most notable changes have been an increase in the housing requirements from 30,500 to 35,175 across the JCS area along with the addition of a number of extra sites, namely at Twigworth, West of Cheltenham and Winnycroft. Significantly the site at MoD Ashchurch has been removed from the plan owing to an ongoing operational need for the site for at least the next 10 years. This has left a supply shortfall of approximately 2,800 for Tewkesbury Borough and the JCS team proposes an immediate review of the plan to address how this will be delivered. Engagement with parish councils and neighbourhood plan groups will be undertaken as part of this process. It is hoped that consultation on a preferred options plan will take place from September 2017.
- f. **The Tewkesbury Food & Drink Festival** returns to the town on the 24th - 25th June 2017 in what is set to be another fantastic event. The festival is again, going back to its roots - being held in the Tewkesbury Abbey grounds and will provide a weekend of fun and foodie delights. All of the original popular highlights will be there including a Food & Drink marquee with more than 60 stalls offering a wealth of local produce including award-winning cheeses, locally reared meat, homemade cakes and pastries, local wine, beer and cider plus much more. Adults £2.50 under 14s FREE. The event will feature a cookery theatre with live demonstrations from local chefs and experts.
