This is the Parish Council sponsored Newsletter for October 2018, giving details of past and forthcoming events and other items we think will be of interest.

1. **Parish Council Notes:**

- a. Firstly a reminder that we are holding another litter picking event this coming Saturday (13th October). We will meet at the Cross at 10 a.m.; so, if you can spare an hour, please come along and help.
- b. With effect from 28th October Gloucestershire County Council's Household Recycling Centres will be closed one day mid-week. On Wednesdays, Wingmoor Farm (Bishops Cleeve) will be closed, and on Thursdays, Hempsted (Gloucester) will be closed. As the evenings get colder and darker, the HRCs across the county receive almost 30 per cent less waste and recycling. In order to reflect this and save taxpayers money, HRCs will be open from 10am until 4pm, six days a week. However, HRCs in the county will still be open on Bank Holiday Mondays and Good Friday, which are especially busy days at the sites. The information on the closure days and new seasonal times are now online at www.recycleforgloucestershire.com .
- The annual Fireworks evening will soon be upon us Saturday 3rd November at Alcock's Farm (the home of Alan & Anabel McKinnon) in Church Lane. There will be a cash bar, and various other "delights". - d. We have been notified by the **Neighbourhood Watch** team that following the recent burglaries circulated to the Tirley and Corse Lawn areas during the last week or so, there have been two further burglaries not too far away. The first was in Corse Lawn between midday and 1pm on Sunday 30th September while the owner popped out. The rear patio doors were forced and left wide open and the whole house was searched. The second was in Druggers End Lane in Castlemorton where a garage was entered overnight on the 28th/29th September. A hedge cutter was stolen. - There has also been a sharp increase in reports about fake TV Licensing emails claiming to offer refunds. The emails state that the refund cannot be processed owing to "invalid account details". The links provided in the emails lead to phishing websites designed to steal personal and financial details. Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.
- As previously announced, agreement has been reached to replace the wooden gate into the field opposite the church. A "Kissing gate" will be installed to prevent any further incidents of cattle escaping and getting into the churchyard. - 5. The guest speaker at this month's meeting of the **Forthampton & District WI** was Liz Spurway, a talented glass artist. She began her talk by introducing the different types of glass used and the equipment required to create various designs. She talked us through techniques and accessories available to enhance each designed piece. Glass fusion can involve two or three pieces of glass, and designs can incorporate crystallised glass, fern placed between the glass (the fern burns and the ash remaining forms a pattern), stencils sprinkled with dry powder and layers of painting which give a three-dimensional effect. All designs are first heated flat in a kiln in order to fuse the glass and different moulds are then

used to achieve the desired shape. Liz ended her talk by placing a small piece of prepared glass in a microwave to demonstrate how the process works. On display were many of her designs, in stunning colours, ranging from earrings to small dishes. Liz also supplies poppies to her local church for Remembrance Sunday – and they are beautiful.
