1. Parish Council Notes:

- a. With effect from 1st October the Village and Community Agents scheme will be combining with "Social Prescribing" to become a new service called Community Connectors. Village and Community Agents have been working across the county for 11 years and helped thousands of older people and communities gain better access to services and information as well as providing support and assistance to those who need it most. Over the past 4 years, Social Prescribing has offered GP practices and other healthcare professionals a mechanism for referring patients who are in need of alternatives to prescribed medicines and has worked closely with Village and Community Agents. The schemes have evolved tremendously over the years, building up networks of referral partners and building vital knowledge about the areas in which they work. We expect that the new providers will communicate their plans over the coming weeks and, from 1st October, relevant contact details will be published so that you can get in touch with the new providers direct.
- b. The Autumn edition of **the Staunton & Corse GP surgery newsletter** has now been published and is attached for reference.
- c. Looking for something a little different to do? How about going along to the Old Baptist Chapel in Tewkesbury on 30th September to discover how a timber-framed building was constructed? There will be a chance to meet a costumed medieval builder who will let you into the secrets of his craft, from mortice and tenon joints to making wattle and daub panels.
