This is the Parish Council sponsored Newsletter for November 2018, giving details of past and forthcoming events and other items we think will be of interest.

1. Parish Council Notes:

- a. It is very pleasing to be able to report that the work to introduce fibre-optic cable into the village to improve Broadband access has finally arrived. There will obviously be some disruption while the work is in progress but, hopefully, this will be temporary and we will all soon be able to access the internet at much faster rates. There is currently a slight hiatus in the work while "Wayleave" questions are addressed but we expect work to re-start very soon.
- b. From Monday 3 to Friday 21 December, Hempsted Household Recycling Centre, near Gloucester, will be temporarily closed to allow some important upgrades to the site. The method used to compact some types of waste and recyclable materials is being changed. A mobile materials handler will replace the existing static compaction equipment which is old, breaks down frequently and has become expensive to maintain. The new method will save money and also give more operational flexibility. The information on this closure can be found at www.recycleforgloucestershire.com. During this closure our closest alternative centre, will be Wingmoor Farm HRC in Stoke Orchard (closed on Wednesdays). Hempsted HRC will re-open on Saturday 22 December.
- c. Members of the public are being asked to help review the options for the Joint Core Strategy which sets out the identified need and location for employment and housing sites, and associated infrastructure, up to 2031. This stage of the review, called 'Issues and Options', will look again at the growth needs and options up to and potentially beyond 2031 and the strategy for delivering them. This review asks members of the public, and any other stakeholders, 15 key questions to help develop a way to best deliver growth, including:
 - What should the scope of the review be?
 - What timeframe should the review plan for?
 - Are the JCS vision, aims and objectives still relevant?
 - How can the review best plan for city/town centres so they remain vital and viable in the future?
 - Are there suitable sites for development?
 - What infrastructure needs should be considered?

The consultation lasts for over eight weeks between Monday, 12 November 2018 and Friday, 11 January 2019. Consultation events will be held in the following locations, where members of the public can come along, ask questions and have their say:

Gloucester Eastgate Shopping Centre on 30 November 10am to 4pm.

Cheltenham Muncipal Offices on 4 December 10am-4pm

Tewkesbury Town Hall on 13 December 4-7pm

- e. The **litter picking** event held on **13th October** was also a great success. It is always interesting to see what strange items people throw into ditches and at the side of the

road; the most unusual object this time was a microwave oven! (See attached photo of the resulting rubbish heap that was guickly removed by the Borough Council personnel.

- Another successful activity was the installation of the Kissing gate into the field opposite the Church. Our happy band of volunteers, led by Richard Ascough, worked diligently in the rain to complete the task, which should prevent further incidents of cattle escaping into the churchyard. - g. And, don't forget, Tewkesbury's Christmas lights will be switched on by Santa Claus on Sunday 25th November. There will be the usual Christmas Market starting at noon, with food, drinks, Christmas gifts & crafts, and free parking.
